

SNAP/CALFRESH

STUDENT ELLIGIBILITY

1

WHAT'S YOUR ENROLLMENT STATUS?

People ages 18-49 taking 6 or more units (half-time) are considered students and must meet 1 student qualification criteria.

2

WHAT IS YOUR EMPLOYMENT STATUS?

If you are working 20 hours a week or 80 hours a month and you have proof, then you may be able to qualify for CalFresh. Students who were approved for a federal or state work study job are also eligible, even if they are not currently working.

DO YOU HAVE A CAL GRANT?

If you receive Cal Grant A or B, are attending a UC or CSU, under the age of 25, unmarried and have a household income of less than \$50,000 a year then you can qualify.

ARE YOU IN ANY OF THESE PROGRAMS?

Students who participate in EOP, EOPS, DSPS, WIOA, CARE, UC McNair, Unaccompanied Refugee Minors (URM), MESA or some Puente Project programs are qualified for CalFresh enrollment.

5

WERE YOU A FOSTER YOUTH?

Students who are part of Guardian Scholars, CAFYES, ETV, FYSI, or Extended Foster Care programs are qualified for CalFresh enrollment.

6

ARE YOU A PARENT?

If you have a child under 6, or between 6 and 12 without adequate child care, or you are a single parent with a dependent under the age of 12 then you may qualify.

7

WHAT IS YOUR INCOME?

The people in your household include anyone that you purchase and prepare food with. Individuals under 22 living with parents, married people who live together, or unmarried people living together with a common child are always 1 household.

Notes for students-

- Applying for SNAP or CalFresh will not affect immigration or financial aid for anyone in your household.
- Financial aid, work-study positions, personal loans that need to be repaid, irregular/occasional money gifts, a one-time lump sum of money does not count as income.
